What is PowerUp?

PowerUp is a leadership development program designed to equip mid- to senior- level women leaders with the skills, mindset, and network needed to drive meaningful change in the energy sector. Through immersive training, one-on-one coaching, and a dynamic peer learning experience, participants will expand their leadership capacity, learn to build high-performing teams, and understand how to navigate complex organizational change. PowerUp helps leaders identify and move beyond their growth edges, adopt an executive mindset, and cultivate a powerful professional network to accelerate their influence and career trajectory.

What Makes PowerUp Unique?

- Long-Term Development Journey: Designed as a continuous learning process with multiple touchpoints, PowerUp provides space to reflect, refine, and apply new skills.
- **Personalized Coaching:** Six hours of 1:1 coaching, combined with a 360° leadership assessment, deepen self-awareness and help leaders develop tailored growth strategies to meet their unique needs.
- Adaptive Leadership Framework: Focuses on building the skills to navigate complex, systemic challenges and drive change in dynamic environments.
- **Applied Leadership Challenges:** Participants tackle real-world challenges by turning program concepts into actionable strategies for themselves and their organizations.

• **Strategic Connections:** Participants develop a robust professional network within the energy sector through peer learning groups, the cohort community, and alumni networks.
